As the Father has loved me, so also I have loved you. Remain in my love. John 15:9

Love is truly a fascinating thing. Love weaves together our words, our emotions, and our actions. Love has levels of expression. I love my students and would be willing to lay down my life for them. But I love my family to an even greater depth and intimacy. Love can be expressed in differing forms: speaking words of affirmation, performing acts of service, giving gifts, spending quality time, or providing physical touch. And for love to be appreciated to its fullest, love must be reciprocal. The beloved must also love the lover.

This is what makes the love of God in Christ Jesus so astounding. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. When we were unlovable and enemies of God, the Holy Spirit reached out to our stony hearts and revived them with the Gospel. When we could not and would not seek God, He sought us as a shepherd seeks the wandering lamb. We did not choose Him, but He chose us and appointed us for work in His vineyard (John 15:16). Greater love has no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. (John 15:13). But Christ exceeded this love. He laid down His life even for His enemies.

How then are we to reciprocate this great love which exceeds all human love? Christ Himself tells how we are to love Him, the Father, and the Holy Spirit. *If you hold on to my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have held on to my Father's commands and remain in his love.* (John 15:10) We remain in His commands when we remain in His word. We do not

despise hearing His word as if it were some burden or obligation on our lives. We gladly hear it, inwardly digest it, and apply it to our lives. God's word becomes for us a great source of joy and confidence and comfort.

We can also reciprocate God's love by remaining productive. We have been called out of death's darkness for a purpose. That purpose is not to simply hold the gospel joy in our hearts, treasuring only its benefits in our lives. That is not productive. It would be like a branch of a grapevine withholding the water and nutrients from a cluster of grapes. Yes, the vine would survive. But the cluster would languish and die.

There is a world out there that needs us to be productive. There are clusters of grapes drying and dying each day because no branch connected to the vine of Christ ever bothered to share with them just what Christ has done for them. Let us then resolve to be productive. Let us resolve to share the good news with others in every opportunity God gives us. We have been appointed to bear fruit that will endure. Let us then reciprocate our love to our God by taking up the Great Commission.

Welcome back to A Step Beyond, our brief Bible study based upon the readings used for service at Immanuel Lutheran Church for this week's worship service on May 5, Sixth Sunday in Easter. Our theme for this study is *Christ is the Example and Reason for Our Love.*

Acts 9:36-42: God showed His love for Joppa by performing a miracle through the Apostle Peter.

- Note that apart from the miracle of conversion, people do not come to faith through miracles. If people came to faith through miracles, all ten of the lepers Christ healed would have returned to Christ in gratitude compelled by their faith. However, miracles had a place in the First Century Church. They drew the attention of people to hear the Gospel. Faith then came to some by hearing the message.
- Why did so many people mourn the death of Tabitha?
 - \circ Her faith had made her well known because of her charity and good deeds.
 - \circ Remember, the world will know we are Christians by our love for one another.
- How does this account make it plain that she was dead?
 - \circ First of all, Luke plainly states that Tabitha had died.
 - \circ Second, her body had been washed in preparation for burial.
- Why, perhaps, is there not a more dramatic account of God raising Tabitha to life through Peter?
 - What is important is not so much the miracle itself but rather the results of the miracle.
 - God has shown His love to Tabitha and the people of Joppa.
 - The miracle caught the attention of the people of Joppa.
 - \circ Many heard the Gospel and, through the work of the Holy Spirit, believed.

1 John 4:19-21: We love because He first loved us.

- Is "We loved because He first loved us" an option for the believer?
 - \circ No, it is not just a possibility, something we could choose to do or not to do.
 - \circ Motivated by the Gospel, the Christian heart is compelled inwardly to love.
 - \circ If we are compelled by the Holy Spirit, we cannot help but love others.
- What does the Apostle John say is an impossibility?
 - \circ To say we love God, yet harbor hate in our hearts towards someone.
 - \circ Hatred is inconsistent with God dwelling within us because God is love.

John 15:9-17: God chose us to believe and to bear much fruit.

- How did Christ show His love for His Father?
 - \circ He obeyed His Father's commands even when they led Him to death on a cross for us.
- How does Christ's love surpass even the highest human love?
 - \circ Humans would be willing to lay down their lives for their friends.
 - Christ laid down His life for even His enemies, for the soldiers gambling for His clothes as well as for His disciples, for the thief that mocked Him on the cross as well as for the thief who believed He was the eternal King.
- How do we know that the Holy Spirit must convert us and that while we were sinners we would not seek for Christ?

 \circ Christ plainly says, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit."

- Why are we to bear much fruit?
 - \circ We bear fruit by building the Kingdom of God by sharing the Gospel.
 - \circ It is a loving response in gratitude for Christ's love for us.
 - \circ There is a world filled with unbelievers that will languish in Hell if we do not.


